I held many jobs in my career at Waters from 1984-2019, including Senior Manager, Global Service Support and Development (2014 - 2019); Manager, Global Service Support (2007 - 2014); and Senior Engineer, Global Service Support (1998 - 2007). My employment took place at the Waters facility in Milford, Massachusetts.

2. I am fully aware of my duties as a class representative. I am not aware of any conflicts of interest between myself and other Class Members.

3. I take my duties as a class representative seriously, and I have attempted to fulfill those duties throughout the course of the litigation. Among other things, I have (1) reviewed the allegations in the Complaint and Amended Complaint; (2) provided information and documents to

counsel to assist in the prosecution of the action; and (3) reviewed the Settlement Agreement in its entirety and communicated with counsel regarding the negotiation of the Settlement.

4. I am fully informed of the terms of the Settlement. I understand that I am a member of the Settlement Class, and I am satisfied with the terms that were reached.

5. I believe the \$800,000 monetary recovery represents a fair recovery for myself and the other Settlement Class Members, and I agree with the Plan of Allocation.

6. In my opinion, the Settlement is fair, reasonable, and adequate, both as to me and as to the other Settlement Class members. I approve the Settlement in this case and encourage the Court to approve the Settlement as well.
